A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



⁴⁸ He replied to him, "Who is my mother, and who are my brothers?"⁴⁹ Pointing to his disciples, he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. ⁵⁰ For whoever does the will of my Father in heaven is my brother and sister and mother."

Jesus had told us who is within His family. Notice within Scripture Jesus does not promote division but rather, faith. He desires that where He is so will be His Father, mother, brothers and sisters. The unfortunate thing that I have noticed lately is that we are not respecting the members of our family as well as we ought.

Notice Jesus does not ask what political party you are participating within. He does not ask what nationality you come from nor does he ask whether you are rich or poor... he only asks whether you love as he does.

The measure of a Christian is found within the extent that they love which means putting aside their differences and building each other up. I have friends in several countries and I do not judge them because they live in their perspective countries. I love them because they are in the human family. Within our own country we have several political affiliations in which a person can belong. I find it problematic that within our own parish we have members who are making comments that are less than desirable about political parties. This family of mine is diverse and I am excited that we have Catholic Christians in all political affiliations for one reason – we become the common denominator in all of the parties – The Christ who dwells in these members is within each affiliation. It is the Christian who is charged to make the presence of Christ known in all aspects of their lives.

Stereotyping, pigeon-holing, labeling, demeaning, ridiculing, condescending are not attributes of Christ nor a person who displays the ability to encounter Christ in the other who is before them. Please, I beg you as your father, change your speech with each other and about each other. If you have nothing to say that can contribute to building up the kingdom of God on earth and no words that are praiseworthy, it is better to observe silence than to wage an attack on your brothers and sisters; your Mother would appreciate that!

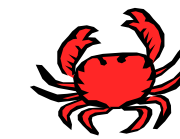


BLUEGRASS FEST

MASS FOR VOCATIONS ON MAY 26TH

The Diocese of Wilmington has no priestly ordinations this year, but the Vocations Office will be holding a Mass for Vocations to promote and pray for more men to consider whether they are being called. **The Mass is scheduled for May 26 at 11 a.m. at the Cathedral of St. Peter in Wilmington.** "It's the same time the ordination would be," said Father Norman Carroll, the director of the Office of Vocations. "We're going to have a blessing of young people who are considering a vocation," Father Carroll said. The Mass, he added, was Bishop Malooly's idea. Priests and religious will be available at St. Peter's to answer any questions and to provide contact information to anyone who expresses interest. The diocesan Vocations Guild, which supports men studying for the priesthood, will be holding an event afterward. In addition, the diocesan seminarians will be done their studies for the year and will be in attendance.
